What's sustainability?


Meeting our needs without compromising future generations' ability to meet theirs


































English, Creative Writing & Literature?

- ★ Level 5 Communications pick a theme, create a character, tell their story
- Level 7 Writing Poetry pick a goal, write a poem about it
- Level 9 Romantic Genius look how these themes were relevant back then!
- Level 11 Creative Writing do some deep research, then get creative
