




Gabh pàirt ann a bhith a' daingneachadh cànan is cultar na Gàidhlig san àm ri teachd airson ginealaichean ri thighinn air na cùrsaichean cànain is leasachaidh againn. Tha iarrtas mòr air eòlaichean Gàidhlig air feadh Alba. Le bhith ag ionnsachadh mu phlanadh mion-chànanan agus mar a bu chòir a chur an sàs san latha an-diugh, faodaidh e dreuchd fhuasgladh san raon shoirbheachail is eadar-dhealaichte seo.



Tha am **BA** (le Urram) Gàidhlig le Leasachadh ag amas air foghlam agus trèanadh a thoirt dhut ann am poileasaidh cànain Gàidhlig agus leasachadh coimhearsnachd, a' toirt dhut nan sgilean a dh'fheumar gus a bhith farpaiseach sa mhargaidh obrach seo a tha a' fàs. Nì thu coimeas eadar cànan is coimhearsnachdan na Gàidhlig agus mion-chànanan is cultaran ann an àiteachan eile, agus gheibh thu greis gnìomhachais trì seachdainean sa chiad bhliadhna, a bharrachd air tursan-raoin agus cothroman ionnsachaidh airson seimeastar aig oilthigh thall- thairis.

Foghlam

Ionnsaich agus brosnaich ginealaichean ùra le do ghràdh don Ghàidhlig. Tòisich do thuras gu bhith a' teagasg Gàidhlig aig ìre bun-sgoile no àrd-sgoile tro chùrsa bogaidh Gàidhlig, le cùrsaichean ag amas air diofar ìrean fileantachd gus do sgilean cànain a thoirt suas gu luath agus aig an aon àm a' leasachadh d' eòlais agus sgilean foghlaim.



Tha mi dìreach far an robh mi an dòchas a bhith!

Bha fios agam gun robh mi airson Gàidhlig a theagasg agus dearbhadh do luchd-ionnsachaidh òga gum faod ionnsachadh chànanan a bhith spòrsail agus ruigsinneach dha na h-uile. Às dèidh na bliadhna dearbhaidh agam, fhuair mi dreuchd san aon sgoil, mar thidsear Gàidhlig làn-ùine. B' e na greisean-gnìomhachais na nithean a b' fheàrr den chùrsa. Seo a' chiad fhìor bhlasad agad de bheatha thidsearan, agus tòisichidh tu a' togail air dàimhean le sgoilearan agus a' tuigsinn, 'Is urrainn dhomh seo a dhèanamh gu dearbh!' Tapadh leibh do UHI airson nan sgilean, misneachd agus togradh a thoirt dhomh airson dreuchd teagaisg a leantainn.

Dhaibhsan a tha fileanta sa Ghàidhlig, comasach air leughadh agus sgrìobhadh sa Ghàidhlig, tha PGDE làn-ùine (Gaelic Pathway) aon bhliadhna cuideachd ma tha ceum iomchaidh aca mu thràth agus gu bheil iad airson a bhith nan tidsearan Gàidhlig aig ìre bun-sgoile no àrd-sgoile no tidsearan cuspair aig ìre àrd-sgoile. Feuch gun toir sibh sùil air an làraich-lìn airson làn riatanasan inntrigidh.

Dèan ionnsachadh aig Ionad Nàiseanta Cànan is Cultar na Gàidhlig, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig san Eilean Sgìtheanach no ann an àrainneachdan beòthail nan Eilean Siar, a' rannsachadh comann shòisealta na Gàidhlig agus a thùsan agus a' sgrùdadh nas doimhne don eachdraidh aige. Ionnsaich mar a bhrosnaicheas tu daoine eile le d' fheòrachas fhad 's a tha thu a' sgrùdadh fhreumhan agus eachdraidh bheairteach na Gàidhlig fhad 's a tha thu a' faighinn ìre àrd de fhileantachd sa chànan.

Is e BA (le Urram) Gàidhlig agus Ceòl an aon phrògram ceuma tro mheadhan na Gàidhlig a leigeas le luchd-ciùil traidiseanta ceòl, eachdraidh agus traidiseanan na Gàidhealtachd a sgrùdadh taobh a-staigh cho-theacsan farsaing na Gàidhlig agus cuspairean co-cheangailte riutha. Leasaich raon de sgilean practaigeach airson gnìomhaidhean aon-neach agus buidhne, dèan ceanglaichean proifeasanta cudromach, cuir eòlas air ionnsachadh làimhseachail anns an stiùidio clàraidh sònraichte againn, agus faigh tlachd bho chothroman air pàirt a ghabhail ann am prògram iomlaid thall-thairis sa cheathramh bliadhna agad.

For those who are fluent Gaelic speakers, able to read and write in Gaelic, there is also a one year full-time PGDE (Gaelic Pathway), if you already have a suitable degree and wish to become a Gaelic teacher at primary or secondary level or a subject teacher at secondary level. Music





Frequently asked questions

+ What qualifications do I need?

Minimum entry qualifications are provided in the summary section on each course webpage. If you do not meet the standard entry requirements, we still encourage you to apply.

+ Do I need to complete my qualifications in one exam sitting?

No, we will accept qualifications gained over more than one sitting.

+ Are there progression routes available?

Yes, most of our courses offer a clear pathway for progression to the next level of qualification, ensuring that you can achieve your ambition. One of our main progression routes at UHI is from HNC/HND.

+ Can I use my qualifications from another institution?

Yes, you can sometimes receive credit for qualifications gained from other institutions. For example, a National Certificate or Higher National qualification in a relevant subject from another institution could be used to assist your application or, in some cases, could provide exemption from parts of a degree.

+ Can I use my work experience as credit for a course?

Yes, we will accept properly evidenced voluntary and paid work experience. You may be asked to provide some additional information with your application and could also be invited for an interview.

What are HNC and HND courses, and why choose one?

Higher National Certificate (HNC) and Higher National Diploma (HND) courses often form the first part of a degree and are ideal if you want to take the first steps into studying whilst keeping your career options open. Flexible, part-time options are available, helping you to fit study around your current job or family commitments.

They offer the chance to:

- » Achieve a qualification highly regarded by employers, giving you both the theoretical knowledge and practical skills valued in today's workplace.
- » Gain access to a degree in fact, an HNC or HND can be a fast-track option to get into the second or third year of a degree, known as articulation.

Minimum entry requirements for international students

Undergraduate degrees

- A-level: two A-levels at grade C or above, including any key subjects required for the course.
- United States: for courses that require Scottish Higher grades B, B, and C, we suggest a High School Graduation Diploma with a minimum grade point average of 2.7 or above.
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma: Award of Diploma with a minimum of 24 points, including any key subjects at Higher Level (HL) Grade 4 or 5, depending on the course.

English language

- + For degree study, you will need an IELTS score of 6.0, with no elements below 5.5

■ How much will it cost me?

At university your main costs will be:

- » Tuition fees the fees charged by us to teach you (see table opposite)
- » Living expenses including your accommodation, food and clothing.

→ How will I pay?

Depending on where you live and your personal circumstances you may be eligible for financial assistance in the form of loans, grants, and bursaries. You should look for student finance as soon as you apply to university, even if you have not yet been offered a place.

→ Scholarships

There are a number of scholarships and bursaries available which can provide a helping hand to enable students to progress in their studies. These are listed on our website: uhi.ac.uk/scholarships

For full-time study:

- » If you are normally resident in Scotland and have a term-time address in Scotland, and you meet the eligibility criteria, your tuition fees are normally paid by the Students Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS) and you can apply for a student loan to help you with your living expenses. There is also a range of other support such as the Young Students' Bursary, Independent Students' Bursary, additional loan and supplementary grants. For full details visit: saas.gov.uk
- » If your home is in the rest of the UK (England, Wales or Northern Ireland) you can apply for loans and grants to cover your tuition fees and living costs through your regional student finance department.

- If you live in Northern Ireland, visit: studentfinanceni.co.uk
- If you are an international student, there may be funding opportunities available for you, visit: uhi.ac.uk/international
- » If you are a national of the European Union, European Economic Area, or Switzerland:
 Following the UK's departure from the European Union, EU/EEA and Swiss nationals, who do not have settled status in the UK, will require a Student Route visa to study here and will be considered as international for fees. Eligible students studying for a degree, full-time, on-campus, will get an automatic scholarship for each year of study: £3,000 for a Bachelor of Arts and £4,000 for a Bachelor of Science, with the fourth (honours) year free.



→ For part-time study:

» If you are normally resident in Scotland and have a term-time address in Scotland, and you are planning to study part-time, you may be eligible for a part-time fee grant from SAAS, visit saas.gov.uk. Or for funding of up to £200 per year through a Skills Development Scotland Individual Training Account, visit skillsdevelopmentscotland.co.uk.

---> For students who require support:

» If you have a particular need, such as a learning difficulty or disability, please speak to your chosen campus about the financial and learning support available to you.

Rest of the UK (RUK) students (based on 2025/26 fees*):

For students living in the rest of the UK (England, Wales, Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or a British overseas territory who are studying full-time:

- » Degree courses are charged at the per annum cost shown in the table below for a maximum of three consecutive years, with the fourth year free. The maximum the maximum fee for a four-year degree is £27,750.
- » All HNC and HND courses are charged at £7,440 per annum for full-time study. Degree courses comprised of an HN award as the first and/or second year will be charged at £7,440 for the HN portion, then the relevant fee for the degree year (fourth year free for continuous study)
- » Part-time fees are pro-rata to full-time fees, based on 120 SCQF credits per year
- » We offer bursaries for full-time study to students who meet the eligibility criteria.
